

CLAIM FOR Restoration of Pension

State of New York, County of Livingston, ss:

ON THIS 25th day of January A. D. 1888; personally appeared before me a

Notary Public in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths,

Lyman B. Gallup aged _____ years, a resident of Oakland

in the County of Livingston and State of New York,

whose Post Office address is the same.

and who, being duly sworn, declares as follows: that he is the identical Lyman B.

Gallup who belonged to Co H 94th NY Vols, and that while serving therein contracted chronic diarrhoea and malarial poisoning. That he made application for pension on account of said disabilities, and the same was granted at the unreasonably low rate of \$2 per month, but payment thereof was made to cease September 19, 1881, on the ground as he is informed and believes that the disability from said cause had ceased.

This action he claims was erroneous and very unjust, as the disability had not then, nor has it yet ceased to exist, on the contrary it has continued, and increased in severity, and therefore he asks that the pension be restored, and paid from the date to which it was last paid, and the rate increased for the future, to correspond with the degree of disability.

The declarant hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,
