MRS. LYSANDER KATELEY.

Miss Anuice Gallop was born in Vermont on April 18, 1821, where she resided with her parents until her marriage to Lysander Kateley, October 14, 1842.

In company with her husband she came west shortly after her marriage and settled in Wisconsin where they made their home for eleven years. From Wisconsin they came to Minnesota and settled in Winona living there for thirteen years. The next change was onto a homestead in Lake Belt Township, this county which homestead she owned at her death.

Seven children were born to her, six of whom she raised thru all the hardship and toil of the pioneer day; two have died in recent years and four are still living, all of whom reside in this immediate vicinity they are Franklyn, William and Lyman Kateley and Mrs. Mary Riser. Her husband preceeded her to the spirit world several years ago.

Mrs. Kateley came from the rugged stock which has done so much to make this country what it is—of that type of New Englander who as soon as they married packed their few possessions on a wagon and on foot, following their ox teams, turned their faces to the unknown west which by their bravery and self sacrifice they have made the most glorious land on all the earth. Who is not proud to say that they have received the breath of life from one of these pioneer mothers.

She was a devoted christian, who trusted in the promises of her Lord and when the call came she was not afraid but was ready meet to those who had gone before.

Her death occurred on Tuesday and the remains were laid at rest in the Lake Belt cemetery yesterday. The funeral services were held at the Ceylon M. E. Church.
