

WILLIAM TALBOT, s. of John and Mary (Cox) Talbot, chr. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, 2-1-1804; d. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., U.S.A., 2-11-1887, of apoplexy; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; farmer; "claimed he had been bewitched in England;" June 1852 immigrated with family to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA.; 1855 pre-empted 160 acres in Sections 14 and 15, St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; purchased additional land in Sections 23 and 26, eventually increasing his property to 340 acres; 1874 divided his farm between sons Fred and George, living with son Fred until his death at age eighty-three; known locally (affectionately) as "Father Talbot;" "a man faithful in all the relations of life;" md. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, 12-31-1822, **Sophia**, d. (perhaps) of John and Hannah (or Anna) Butler; she b. (Somerset?) c. 1800; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., U.S.A., 12-28-1858; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; 1-10-1853, Sophia's brother and sister-in-law wrote from Shepton Mallet, Somerset, in response to a letter from Sophia dated 11-1-1852, "tendering your health and welfare in every respect as dear as our own. Our great distance and long absence from each other makes us more anxious to gain all the information we can from each other. It will be a great consolation to us to hear from you at all convenient Seasons, and give us all the information you possibly can. Christmas is now over and we sincerely trust you have one and all enjoyed yourselves with the good Old English Fare which is duly appropriated to the season. I can assure you that you were not absent from our thoughts on that occasion. Although distance at the present time deprives us of a Verbal interview with each other, we sincerely trust that we shall be able to enjoy each others company, before the hand of Death shall be laid on us."

WILLIAM TALBOT, b. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, England, 5-22-1822, s. of William and Sophia (Butler) Talbot; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 1-3-1891, of "paralysis;" bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; raised on dairy farm with few educational advantages; May 1850 immigrated to central New York with sisters Mary Ann and Sarah and brother Henry; 1851 moved to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., where he met the rest of his family the following year; 1854 pre-empted 160 acres in Section 14, St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., where he lived for the rest of his life; his funeral held in Vowles School near his home; "a most respected citizen;" md. Independence, Buchanan County, IA., 10-1-1857, Martha Elizabeth, d. of James and Ann (Stower) Baker; she b. Burnham, Somerset, England, 8-17-1830; d. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 10-3-1895, of "general paralysis complicated with lung trouble;" bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; came as a small girl with her parents to IA.; early religious experience led to affiliation with Advent Church; following her husband's death she sold the farm and moved into a house in St. Charles, where she lived with her son Jesse until her death; "a faithful, active Christian" who "always led an exemplary life."

Winona County, MN., 1-17-1883, John Edward, s. of William and Emily (Day) Petheram; he. b. Winona County, MN., 9-3-1854; d. Madison, Lake County, SD., 2-26-1935.
- 3) Agnes Martha Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 2-2-1862; d. Winona County, MN., 8-10-1899, of tuberculosis; married in her mother's house in St. Charles, MN.; "six of her cousins laid her to rest in Hillside Cemetery;" md. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 3-1-1893, Alva George, s. of John and Sarah (Talbot) Ham; he b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 7-19-1857; d. Rochester, Olmsted County, MN., 8-7-1937; Alva George md. (2) Marshall, Lyon County, MN., 6-26-1900, Alice Phyllis, d. of Thomas C. and Phillis (Talbot) Barr; she b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 2-13-1870; d. Rochester, Olmsted County, MN., 3-8-1957.
- 4) Albert Henry Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 5-20-1864; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 10-25-1864.
- 5) Anna Elizabeth "Annie" Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 11-1-1865; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 2-6-1885, of consumption; "in her times of greatest suffering, [she] loved to draw her mother nearer and nearer to her and talk of her release from pain and long to be at rest; our community . . . lost a valuable member, our society an earnest worker, and the mourning family . . . an obedient daughter and a loving sister."
- 6) George Henry Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 7-12-1867; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 1-15-1872; inscription on his gravestone, Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN., reads, "He sleeps but not forever."
- 7) Alfred Jasper Jesse Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 4-1-1869; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 2-10-1870.
- 8) Jesse William Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 2-13-1871; d. Portland, Multnomah County, OR., 5-21-1952; was a junior partner in St. Charles Furniture Store where on 10-3-1903, he was coming up the basement stairs the moment the St. Charles cyclone leveled the building (he wasn't injured); 1905 moved to Portland, Multnomah County, OR., where he later owned a grocery store; "with his honest dealing, open-heartedness and genial manners, he [was] one of the most respected and honored gentlemen of his town;" md. Winona County, MN., 11-26-1902, Caroline F. "Carrie," d. of Mr. and Mrs. Gustave Krause; she b. c. 1872; d. Portland, Multnomah County, OR., 4-23-1943; "she possess[ed] all the sweet refinements and accomplishments which go to make up a perfect lady, and her loving disposition and affable ways [won] her steadfast friends."

9) Cora Ella Talbot, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 8-9-1872; d. Dover Township, Olmsted County, MN., 7-15-1916; md. Winona County, MN., 10-15-1890, Lewis H., s. of Hezekiah and Elizabeth (Davidson) Lybarger; he b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 8-23-1859; d. Dover Township, Olmsted County, MN., 9-2-1936; Lewis md. (1) 3-1-1884, Laura, d. of George and Eliza (Day) Persons; she b. Winona County, MN., 3-29-1863; d. Winona County, MN., 9-4-1889.

MARY ANN "POLLY" TALBOT, b. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, England, 2-4-1824, d. of William and Sophia (Butler) Talbot; d. Manchester, Delaware County, IA., 11-25-1915; bd. Mt. Hope Cemetery, Dyersville, IA.; May 1850 immigrated to central New York with brothers William and Henry and sister Sarah; two years later met rest of family and moved to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA.; 1-23-1888 signed quit-claim deed to her father's property in St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; "a woman of earnest Christian life and character . . . kind, generous and thoroughly unselfish;" md. Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., 4-6-1854, George Hatch; he b. (Stone Allerton?) Weare, Somerset, England, 8-21-1824; d. Manchester, Delaware County, IA., 11-6-1897; bd. Mt. Hope Cemetery, Dyersville, IA.; shoemaker; immigrated to America at age twenty-one; returned to England to marry his first wife Hannah ----; 1849 settled in Dubuque County, IA.; 1852 started overland for California with Hannah and their only child, both of whom died on the journey; returned to Iowa, settling in North Fork Township, Delaware County; 1854 md. (2) Mary Ann Talbot; farmed in Section 1, North Fork Township, Delaware County, IA., until 1885 when they moved into Manchester, Delaware County, IA.; "a man of friendly and affable disposition."

Cedar Rapids, Linn County, IA., 10-7-1935; b. in a log cabin near Earlville, Delaware County, IA.; lived for a year after his marriage in western IA.; then farmed near Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., until 1901 when he moved into Manchester, Delaware County, IA.; living with daughter in Cedar Rapids, Linn County, IA., at time of death; member of Manchester Masonic lodge No. 165, A.F. & A.M.; "a man of great integrity and great kindness of heart, thoroughly devoted to his family;" md. IA., 2-14-1884, Isadore Elizabeth Bryan; she b. Dubuque County, IA., 10-28-1859; d. Manchester, Delaware County, IA., 5-5-1931; b. in a log cabin on her parents' farm near Worthington, Dubuque County, IA.; member of Methodist Church and Order of the Eastern Star; "for nearly half a century she and her husband trod life's pathway in complete harmony and happy companionship."

6) Frederick John "Jack" Hatch, b. Delaware County, IA., 8-22-1862; d. Storm Lake, Buena Vista County, IA., 3-21-1920; 1883 moved to farm near Early, Sac County, IA.; spent last 10 years of his life living in Storm Lake, Buena Vista County, IA.; he "had a wonderful faculty of making friends;" md. (Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA?) 1-26-1881, Florence Amelia "Flora" Perhamus; she b. PA. 2-14-1861; d. Storm Lake, Buena Vista County, IA., 3-12-1939; at age of three moved with parents to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA.; md. (2) 6-22-1927, Martin Olson; he d. 6-8-1929.

7) Albert G. Hatch, b. IA., 10-5-1863; d. Manchester, Delaware County, IA., 10-11-1887, of "malarial fever;" farmed with parents in North Fork Township, Delaware County (probably until 1885); was working for railroad in Nebraska at time of death; took sick and was accompanied by father back to Manchester, where he died in his parents' house.

SARAH TALBOT, b. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, England, 7-22-1829, d. of William and Sophia (Butler) Talbot; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 12-28-1892; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; May 1850 immigrated to central New York with brothers William and Henry and sister Mary Ann; met rest of family in 1852 and moved to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA.; 1855 moved with husband to St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; 1-23-1888 signed a quit-claim deed to her father's property in St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; md. Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., 7-12-1853, John Ham; he b. Somerset, England, 6-26-1828; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 5-14-1899, of hepatitis; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; 1850 immigrated to western Dubuque County, IA.; fall of 1855 pre-empted 160 acres in Sections 21 and 28, St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., building in the center of the claim a log cabin that stood for several decades; increased property (known as "Sugar Loaf Farm") to 353 acres; raised grain and stock; 1882 average crop yields per acre: wheat, 14 and 1/2 bushels; barley, 40 bushels; oats, 45 bushels; corn, 40 bushels; timothy-seed, 7 bushels; assisted in raising the mill at Stockton, Winona County, MN.; "a man of sterling qualities and good works; kind and thoughtful . . . in his family and a good neighbor."

St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 3-()-1956; farmed in St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., until moving into city of St. Charles in 1900; md. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 6-20-1894, Minnie Rosetta, d. of Mr. and Mrs. Ben J. Johnson; she b. 2-18-1866; d. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 9-9-1953; taught school prior to marriage.

6) Anna Sophia Ham, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 6-10-1867; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 7-5-1867.

7) Sarah Winifred "Winnie" Ham, b. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 1-7-1869; d. Rochester, Olmsted County, MN., 10-23-1953; member of Trinity Episcopal Church and guild, St. Charles, MN.; md. 10-31-1894, William Lucas "Will" Hardwick; he b. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 1-1-1864; d. Winona County, MN., 4-10-1929; spent time in his youth in California and in Alexandria, Douglas County, MN.; machinist for Chicago & North Western Railway, Winona, Winona County, MN.; 35-year resident of Winona, Winona County, MN.

ANNA TALBOT, b. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, England, 7-4-1830, d. of William and Sophia (Butler) Talbot; d. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 7-3-1914; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; raised on a dairy farm; June 1852 immigrated with parents and siblings to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA.; 1866 moved with husband and sons to St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; 1-23-1888 signed quit-claim deed to her father's property in St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; lived with son F. Asher Turner on his farm in Section 20, Westside Township, Nobles County, MN., after her husband's death; died while visiting her brothers Fred and George in St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; md. Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., 1-()-1853, Alfred Turner; he b. Maiden Bradley, Wiltshire, England, 8-20-1830; d. Magnolia, Rock County, MN., 1-2-1905; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; 1852 immigrated to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., at the same time as the Talbot family, with whom he was acquainted (his descendants told the story that the Talbot family left England partly because they did not approve of Alfred's interest in their

daughter Anna); he and Anna remained in Dyersville until moving to St. Charles, Winona County, MN., in 1866, where he worked as a tailor; May 1904 moved to Magnolia, Rock County, MN.

Gardner's drugstore in St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; 1881 accepted position as prescription clerk in a drugstore at Fond Du Lac, Fond du Lac County, WI.; "he won the high regard of all with whom he became acquainted."

HENRY "HANK" TALBOT, b. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, England, 5-1-1833, s. of William and Sophia (Butler) Talbot; d. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 7-12-1907, of "carconia of liver" (according to his death record; his obituary cites asthma as cause of death); bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; May 1850 immigrated to central New York with brother William and sisters Mary Ann and Sarah, where he learned blacksmithing; 1854 moved west, stopped briefly at Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA., and then moved to St. Charles, Winona County, MN., where he opened a blacksmith shop; pre-empted 160 acres in Section 22, St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; 1860 merged blacksmith business with H.C. Parrott and Charles Ellsbury's repair shop under the name H.C. Parrott & Company; this firm remained in continuous operation under that name for approximately forty years; member of Knights Templar; md. Winona County, MN., 8-12-1862, Elizabeth, d. of William and Mary (Cummins) Hendee; she b. Dundas, Ontario, Canada, 6-10-1844; d. Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA., 5-12-1929; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; moved at age 12 with parents to St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; lived with Henry in their house on St. Charles Avenue, St. Charles, MN., for over forty years; in widowhood moved with her children to Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA.

3) Juanita T. "Nita" Talbot, b. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 12-30-1872; d. Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA., 4-24-1952; married in an Episcopal service in her parents' home on St. Charles Avenue; music provided by her sister Alta; St. Charles military band escorted newlyweds to train depot as they departed for their honeymoon; "few young people ever started out in life together with better prospects for the future;" 1913 she moved to Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA.; worked as a bookkeeper for many years; md. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 10-27-1896, Will E., s. of Nathan and Anna L. Cross; he b. Saratoga Township, Winona County, MN., 8-5-1871; d. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 1-13-1897, of acute peritonitis; clerked first for H.J. Keeler and then for A.F. Kuebler and Company in St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; later went into business for himself in Chatfield, Fillmore County, MN.; member of the Masonic Fraternity, Knights Templar and Modern Woodmen of America; d. at the home of his wife's parents after an illness of twelve days; funeral services conducted by Rev. W.W. Fowler, who two and a half months earlier had married Will and Juanita; Will was "a jovial good-natured young man . . . universally liked."

Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA., 12-10-1964; md. in her parents' house in the presence of a small number of guests; 1912 moved with family to Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA.; member of First Presbyterian Church, Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA.; 1958 chosen "Woman of the Year" in Westminster Women's Guild; md. St. Charles, Winona County, MN., 6-15-1904, Charles Francis "Frank," son of Francis W. and Hannah (King) Knapp; he b. Plainview, Wabasha County, MN., 6-11-1875; d. Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA., 10-19-1925; cashier at Citizens State Bank, St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; worked two years in a bank in Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA.; then farmed on a ranch on Wenatchee Heights near Wenatchee, Chelan County, WA.

PHILLIS TALBOT, b. West Pennard, Glastonbury, Somerset, England, 12-27-1838, d. of William and Sophia (Butler) Talbot; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 9-8-1889, of heart failure; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; June 1852 immigrated with parents and siblings to Dyersville, Dubuque County, IA.; 1855 moved with parents and siblings to St. Charles, Winona County, MN.; 1-23-1888 signed a quit-claim deed to her father's property in St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; "she was a loving wife, an affectionate mother, and always lived a Christian life;" md. Winona County, MN., 7-2-1860, Thomas Cook, s. of Thomas and Christina (Slater) Barr;

he b. Paisley, Renfrew, Scotland, 6-2-1829; d. St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN., 3-16-1912; bd. Hillside Cemetery, St. Charles, MN.; orphaned before he was thirteen months old; labored in a shawl factory from age six to age fifteen, when he went to work on a farm; immigrated to Quincy, Adams County, IL., at age twenty-one; 1854 pre-empted 160 acres in Section 5, St. Charles Township, Winona County, MN.; later added 180 acres in Elba Township, Winona County; property was called "Oak Grove Farm;" lived first in a log house, then in a frame house that burned, and finally in a brick house; member of Congregational Church; a republican who did "not meddle in political affairs."
