

Mrs. George B. Talbot, Pioneer Resident of Winona, Is Dead

**Came to Winona as
Bride in 1874 and Has
Made Her Home Here
Since — Funeral on
Wednesday.**

Mrs. George B. Talbot, aged 85, pioneer resident of Winona county, and widow of the late George B. Talbot, passed away at 1 a. m. today, after a short illness, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. F. Camp, 718 West Wabasha street.

She was born at Allenton, Somersetshire, England, August 20, 1841. She migrated to America with parents when a child at the age of six. The family finally located in Dubuque County, Iowa, which was her home until she was married to Geo. B. Talbot March 11, 1874, and came as a bride to Winona County which has been her home ever since.

Surviving relatives are her two daughters, Mrs. C. F. Camp and Mrs. Frank Wunderlich both of Winona, and four sisters and one brother, Mrs. F. Talbot, St. Charles; Mrs. William Duckett, Oakland, Cal.; F. Whitting, Dyersville, Ia.; Mrs. Elizabeth Jackson, Oak Park, Ill.; Mrs. F. Evans, Early, Ia.

Mrs. Talbot was preceded in death by her husband three years and one month.
